

Thanks for the email – I have looked through the documentation concerning the loan of Paddy – yes, you are correct in saying that Paddy was not removed from the granite base – I do apologize for that, he was in actual fact removed in October 2001 when loaned for the Centenary of Federation and later re-attached.

Please find attached a series of emails regarding the crating and transportation of the Paddy Hannan statue and subsequent cracking of the cement. It was thought that since permission had been requested and given to remove the statue from the base that this had indeed happened as there was no further communication. Thank you very much for the condition report although it is not dated nor the assessor details given. The fact that the statue was or was not removed from the base has no bearing on the problem of the cracking of the cement and possible solutions to rectify the situation.

It seems that according to the emails attached the cracking to the cement happened in transit to Canberra and the return trip to Kalgoorlie-Boulder has thus aggravated the condition. The statue when returned to Kalgoorlie-Boulder was only partially wrapped in bubble wrap and polypropylene sheeting and high density foam used in the areas where contact was made with the tie-downs (see attached photograph).

It would seem unfair to hold the transport company liable as correct crating was the responsibility of the Museum and according to the attached email no representative from the Museum was present when the statue was packed for transportation(Section 3 of Loan Agreement IL 2010/0296), nor was crating discussed with the Lender, even though it is referred to in the attached emails and concerns expressed by the Lender.

I look forward to further discussions.

From the condition report attached in your email, it states the statue left Kalgoorlie in two parts. The statue arrived as a whole (bronze attached to granite) at the National Museum of Australia. Was the work undertaken by West Australian Museum done in Perth or Kalgoorlie? I have spoken with our Conservation staff member who worked on the Paddy Hannan statue when it arrived at in Canberra and at no stage was the copper statue removed from the granite base. I have attached two documents from the NMA. The first is a condition/treatment report from our collection management system. Our conservator, states the only treatment done was brush vacuuming. The second document is email correspondence between City of Kalgoorlie-Bolder staff member and states that is was okay to remove the statue from granite base. This information was passed onto our Conservation staff, however they deemed it was not necessary to remove the statue from it's base. No further action was taken.
