Drawing the Lines 2008: A national political cartooning competition for upper primary and secondary schools

The National Museum of Australia invites upper primary and secondary school students to enter a political cartooning competition as part of the National Museum's exhibition *Behind the Lines: The Year's Best Cartoons*.

Behind the Lines is a political humour exhibition which displays the works of some of Australia's finest cartoonists and political satirists and reviews the year in politics in 2008.

The best of the student cartoons will be featured as part of the website and exhibition displays, and may also be used by the Museum for advertising or promotional purposes. Winner, runner-up and highly commended students will be awarded monetary prizes. Winners and runners-up will be provided with travel and accommodation for themselves and their parent/teacher/guardian to attend the awards ceremony in Canberra.

In order for your child to participate, you need to complete this form and return it to your child's school. This provides the National Museum of Australia with:

- non-exclusive rights to reproduce, publish and exhibit images in any form (including electronic media and on the Museum's website) of the artwork made by your child
- permission to publish your child's name and school name with images of your child's artwork.
