Make a LEGO[®] bird



Try making your favourite object out of LEGO, inspired by the amazing creations in the <u>Towers of Tomorrow with LEGO® Bricks</u> exhibition at the National Museum of Australia.

Fun fact: The word 'Lego' comes from the Danish phrase 'leg godt', meaning 'play well'

Time and difficulty

10 minutes to 1 hour, depending on what you make. We made a LEGO rosella inspired by a crimson rosella specimen from the Museum's education handling collection. It took about 30 minutes.


What you need


LEGO! We used 41 blocks for this creation.


Steps

- 1. Decide what type of bird you want to make. You can use your imagination, look at pictures, or copy our rosella
- 2. Gather and lay out your LEGO pieces
- 3. Sort the pieces into colours and sizes
- 4. Put the blocks together to give your 2D bird shape and colour







